Give your resolution time to become a habit

New routines don't just become a habit overnight. <u>A 2009 study</u> found that on average, it takes 66 days to form a new habit. Be patient with yourself. If you have minor setbacks or don't hit your goal one week, pick it back up the next week. Just keep working at your goal and eventually it can become second nature.


James Clear who wrote **Atomic Habits** suggests that although it takes 66 days to form a habit, the most important aspect is to consistently repeat the desired behavior over time. It's not a finish line to cross but rather a process to maintain. We recommend the book if this is an area of interest.


